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From the Board Chair

If one were to attribute the 'success' of an organisation that owns and operates schools to student enrolment, then 2022 would have been one of the most successful years in the history of our Association.

With enrolments across our four schools climbing over the 1,100 mark for the first time ever, we currently have the highest number of students since Calvin was founded in 1962. However, as a Christian organisation, although we acknowledge that enrolment growth is important, we know that our success cannot simply be measured by the number of students we have in our schools.

For us, success should not be linked to how many students we have in our schools or even how well our schools are tracking financially or academically. Our

success ought to be rooted in our underlying purpose or rationale for existence. It is crucial to have a distinct comprehension of our schools' purpose, as it is only by understanding our purpose that we can gauge our success in terms of whether or not we are fulfilling it.

The purpose and Mission of Christian Schools Tasmania is to deliver the highest quality Christcentred education that prepares and equips students for life. Our Mission is underpinned by our overarching Vision of becoming a transformational Christian learning community. In 2022, I believe we have continued to be faithful to our calling and we have maintained our Christian distinctive with a wholly-committed Christian staff cohort. This foundational belief has ensured that our schools have continued to operate as a distinctively Christian learning environment. This hasn't been

an easy task and we are thankful for God's provision of dedicated Christian staff, often at just the right moment.

2022 also saw us close out our previous five-year Strategic Plan, making way for a new season with a revised Strategic Plan. This gave me pause to reflect on not just the past year but my five years as Board Chair and nine years serving on the Board as a Director. Reading back over our plans formulated five years ago, I was struck by God's incredible grace towards us, which has seen several years of sustained growth and transformation in our schools.

When we set our previous Strategic Plan in place, no one could have predicted the effects of a global pandemic. We navigated our way through this with great resilience on a trajectory of continual growth. This is again a testament to God's

grace and goodness. Together with our CEO David Gillman, I am grateful to each of our school leadership teams who guided us through this challenging period.

As noted above, enrolment growth across all our schools has continued, with enrolments increasing more than 30% over the past five years, including a doubling of the number of students at Channel! This has meant we have been able to operate on a sustainable footing while ensuring our facilities are fit for purpose, accommodate a growing number of students, and at the same time being able to plan for the future. More importantly, another 180 families are now able to access a truly excellent Christian education. Throughout this, we have maintained an attainable fee structure for parents that ensures any Christian family who desires and values a Christian education for their child does not miss out.

But it's not just numerical growth that has occurred across our organisation. I am thankful for the advances our schools have made in the training of our teachers with the implementation and integration of new teaching and information systems. These now more accurately measure student academic growth and have significantly improved how this is reported to parents.

This year particularly, the 'Teachers Together' training event was a

huge success, with all CST teachers coming together for a collaborative planning day under the guidance of our Head of Curriculum and Pedagogy, Dr Chris Rayner. Sessions included leadership training with a view to developing leaders from within our organisation and continuing to help our teachers build a curriculum that is distinctively Christian. I am confident that each of our schools are equipped to deliver learning and teaching programs that enable every student to achieve at their optimum.

Over the last few years, we've seen improvements to the standard of our communications with regular communication to not just our parent body but the wider school community. This has included formal publications that have ensured the reputational brand and visibility of each of our schools has continued to grow in the community.

Our schools have been responsible for holding some amazing community events, including the Light Festival at Northern, the Walking in the Light at Calvin and the Channel Lantern Walk around the streets of Margate. These have helped us to (literally) be a light in the darkness to our communities. We have continued to build our Association membership and have launched our giving and engagement initiatives.

Finally, as I have reflected before, all our schools now share common Vision, Mission and Values. These have served to further unify our schools, enhance their cooperative partnership, and maintain our firm focus, providing students with the highest quality Christ-centered education.

And we're not finished yet! As I step down as Board Chair it's my prayer that we maintain our commitment to building a bright future for the students we have the privilege of nurturing and educating each day, that we continue to be faithful to our calling, and that we remain open to be used by God to transform the communities in which we live.

From the CEO



'I look forward with hope and in faith, for a brighter future for each student and family who call our schools home.'

Reflecting on 2022, I am once again reminded of what a faithful and good God we serve. Not that I am at all surprised, as there are dozens of passages and stories in the Bible where God shows His faithfulness and goodness to His people.

We know that His faithfulness has nothing to do with our faith, as the writer of Timothy tells us "if we are faithless, He remains faithful, for He cannot disown himself" (2 Timothy 2:13).

The faithfulness and goodness that I am specifically referring to is the way in which God continues to bless our schools, not only with increased enrolments from wonderful and supportive families who value Christian education but amazing staff as well. Staff who go above and beyond; staff who feel called to Christian education;

staff who value each child in our schools as a special and unique creation of God; staff who live out our values of faith, hope and love each and every day.

Despite the ongoing challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, we welcomed a new year of opportunities to encounter God, trust Him, worship Him, and serve Him with our talents and gifts. In 2022, we had the privilege of impacting the lives of over 1,100 students across our four schools.

In 2022 at Census (August), CST had consolidated enrolments across all four schools of 1,150 students. This is an increase of nearly 6% from the prior year, when we had 1,088 students in total during the same period and an increase of 32% over the past five years! Whilst I would see all of our schools being success stories, the big success story is Channel,

where enrolments over the past five years (2017 to 2022) have nearly doubled, with Channel starting the year in 2017 with 79 students and finishing 2022 with 151 students! All the glory obviously goes to God, for whom nothing is impossible (Luke 1:37; Matthew 19:26; Luke 18:27). However, I do need to acknowledge Margaret Louw and her team for their unwavering commitment to the school in the face of adversity and for their contribution to bringing about such a dramatic turnaround.

In 2022, we were able to continue exciting capital works projects that began in 2021, including the opening of the new carpark for Calvin Primary, the commencement of work on the new Channel hall (with many in the community surprisingly lamenting the demolition of the old 'Gym Shed'!), refurbishments of Northern and Calvin's administration blocks,



and redevelopment of the Calvin Primary sports courts. Additionally, plans for four new classrooms at Calvin Primary are being developed for approval by the Board, and we received an extremely generous donation from Calvin's Community Engagement Committee (formerly the Calvin School Council) to install play equipment on the Primary and Senior campuses.

In 2022, God continued to bless the organisation with talented and committed staff. At this year's New Staff Orientation, we had 30 staff in attendance! Some were staff who joined us at the end of 2021, but many were new staff (teachers and teacher aides) who joined us this year. As with a number of events we planned to run in January, the format of our New Staff Orientation required some modification, resulting in us running this session online. Due to our commitment to minimising large group gatherings

at this time, we made the decision to cancel our combined schools Dedication Event that was scheduled for late January and also made the decision to run the CEN Tasmanian State Conference (which CST hosted in Hobart) as an online event. We are hoping to be able to host this event again in 2023 in person.

I would like to take the opportunity of thanking the CST Board for all that they do to provide sound governance to the organisation, and in particular, thank Scott Parnham, who will be stepping down as Board Chair at the 2023 Annual General Meeting. Scott has served the Board with diligence and distinction for the past nine years, serving as a Board Director, the Chair of the Finance Committee and for the past five years as the Board Chair. Scott has brought much wisdom to the Board and has been a wonderful

support to me in my role as CEO. Scott has a clear passion for Christian education, and all three of his children attended Calvin Christian School. Scott has brought a background of strong governance acumen, commercial skills and corporate experiences to the Board and I know he will be missed when he retires.

God bless you as you continue to support and partner with our schools.





Addressing the problem

During Term 4, our CEO attended a Round Table meeting with Minister Jason Clare in Canberra to discuss a number of issues facing the independent schooling sector. One of the main issues that was discussed was a crisis across all education sectors of teacher shortages.

With this in mind, we announced to our communities in Term 4 2022 that in 2023 we would launch the Tasmanian Teaching Hub through which Teacher Trainees will prepare for a career in teaching while making a difference in our Christian schools now.

The Program

Being part of the Teaching Hub means that Teacher Trainees will:

- study together in a Christ-centred environment, building strong Biblical foundations for learning and teaching;
- · be immersed in the school context throughout their course, authentically connecting theory and practice; and
- receive ongoing support and mentoring, in preparation for employment as a teacher on course completion.

Christian Schools Tasmania (CST) will also ensure consistent opportunities for work as a Teacher Aide for Teacher Trainees throughout their course and pay 50% of course fees (HECS).
